We are committed to improving our practices to combat slavery and human trafficking.

Organisation's structure

We are a dealer of Caravans, Motorhomes, Campervans, Static Caravans and Lodges and provide maintenance and storage services, Caravan Sites and ancillary services in the Caravan and Motorhome sector. We are a privately owned Company and our head office is in the UK. We generally operate in the UK and do not normally operate directly outside this area

Our business

Our business is organised into several business units: Sales, After Sales, Shop, Sites, Plant Nursery and Cafe

Our supply chains

Our supply chains include: Manufacturers of Caravans, motorhomes etc. (and parts), suppliers of plants etc. and suppliers of food and drink

Our policies on slavery and human trafficking

We are committed to ensuring that there is no modern slavery or human trafficking in our supply chains or in any part of our business. Our Anti-slavery Policy reflects our commitment to acting ethically and with integrity in all our business relationships and to implementing and enforcing effective systems and controls to ensure slavery and human trafficking is not taking place anywhere in our supply chains.

Due diligence processes for slavery and human trafficking

As part of our initiative to identify and mitigate risk we publish the Policy on the Salop Leisure website for public access and seek assurances from our suppliers that they have appropriate Policies in place

We have in place systems to:

- Identify and assess potential risk areas in our supply chains.
- Mitigate the risk of slavery and human trafficking occurring in our supply chains.

- Monitor potential risk areas in our supply chains.
- Protect whistle blowers.

Supplier adherence to our values

We have zero tolerance to slavery and human trafficking. We seek to ensure that we only deal with suppliers who are reputable and share our values. We have a compliance team, which consists of involvement from the following departments:

- Legal
- Accounts
- Human resources
- Procurement
- Sales.

Training

To ensure a high level of understanding of the risks of modern slavery and human trafficking in our supply chains and our business, we provide training to our staff.

Our effectiveness in combating slavery and human trafficking

We use the following key performance indicators (KPIs) to measure how effective we have been to ensure that slavery and human trafficking is not taking place in any part of our business or supply chains:

To raise awareness of slavery and human trafficking by bringing the contents of this Policy to the attention of our staff

Publish it on our Website

Require staff that induct new employees to introduce employees to the Policy

Review all existing supply chains and request details of their own Policies

Covid 19

We have reviewed our systems and training and adapted to comply with the additional requirements of the pandemic
